







CORK-FASTNET-CORK UIM WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP 2020 ADVANCE NOTICE OF RACE



ADVANCE NOTICE

In association with the UIM, the Powerboat Association of Northern Ireland and the Irish Power Boat Association (IPBA) the organising club for the 2020 UIM World Championship is the Royal Cork Yacht Club (RCYC).

RACE STATUS

UIM World Championship Endurance Marathon 2020. Classes – Grand Touring, Grand Sport, Grand Pri and Super Marathon

VENUE & DATES

Royal Cork Yacht Club, Crosshaven, Co. Cork, Ireland. Race Day will be Saturday 11th July 2020. (Weather permitting) Dry Pits will open on Thursday 9th July and will close on Sunday 12th July. Wet Pits will be available at RCYC Crosshaven from 10.00 hrs on Friday 10th July until 18.00 hrs on Saturday 11th July.

Competition for the UIM World Championship Endurance Marathon 2020 will take place over two races. Weather permitting, both races will be held on the same day. (Be advised that some changes to the course may occur in the Final Race Instructions)

Race 1: Course is approximately 136 Nm in Length. To honour the Royal Cork Yacht Clubs hosting of the 1st International Powerboat race in 1903, The muster area will be in the harbour area adjacent to the 1903 Royal Cork Yacht Club building (Now the Sirius Arts Centre) in Cobh, Co. Cork. The race course then proceeds through Cork Harbour, turning south west to run alongside the Cork coast until it reaches Ireland's most southerly point at Mizen Head. At Mizen Head the route will turn toward the iconic Fastnet Rock Lighthouse and once the lighthouse is rounded will head east on the designated return route to the finish line at a fixed point near the entrance of Cork harbour.



Race 2: Course is approximately 65 Nm in Length.

The Start/ Finish Line will be a designated fixed point near the entrance of Cork harbour.

Race course will complete a circuit from and to Cork harbour through a designated route off the south/ south east coast of Co. Cork



Race 1 to Race 2: The Start/Finish Line for race 2 is also the Finish line for race 1.

Once the Team has crossed the finish line for Race 1, the team have 1 Hour before it has to start race 2, If the team wish to continue racing or not avail of full 1 hour break, they can request permission to an earlier start time by contacting the OOD. This gives the Teams the option of a break in racing if they choose to do so.

In the case a boat fails to start race 2 at its allocated time, the timekeeper will register the Boat's race 2 start time as per its allocated Time and allow a further 30 mins for the boat to cross the start line. Failure to cross the start line during this extra 30 mins will lead to disqualification.

Bad Weather Course: Details of Bad weather Course will be published in the Advance Program / Race instructions.

Racing Rules: Racing will be governed by the 'Rules' as defined in the UIM Pleasure Navigation Rulebook 2020 (Section 506), the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGS) or any other rules as set down in the Advance program / Race instructions.

Nations Trophy

In honour of the Inaugural Race for the "British International Trophy for Motorboats" which was a race between nations and hosted by the RCYC in 1903, a special Trophy has been commissioned for this event.

This "Nations Trophy" will be presented to the Nation whose competitors have the highest accumulated points score across all classes. (Only Points from the Nation's top place finisher in each Class will be taken into consideration.)





LICENCE

All competitors must hold a 2020 UIM International Racing Licence. Overseas entries will also need a letter of ratification from their UIM National Authority.

ELIGIBILITY

The UIM World Championship Endurance Marathon Race is open to all Powerboats which meet the specifications as laid down in UIM Pleasure Navigation Rulebook – Section 506 - RULES FOR UIM ENDURANCE MARATHON RACING

Number of crew: Minimum 2. Minimum age: 18 Years

ENTRY

ENTRY OPEN - 24th February 2020

For Safety & Logistics reasons, the maximum number of entries has been set at 24 Boats. Priority will be given to the first 6 entries received in each class.

Entry Fee: Discounted rate €750 for entries received by 1st April 2020 - €950 for entries received between 1st April and the closing date of 1st June.
